FIELD NOTES

The VSGA Women's Four-Ball Championship returns to Fawn Lake for the third time and for the first time since 2022. That

year produced a memorable finish in the open division, as twin sisters Jessica and Sarah Spicer (pictured) outlasted Alexandra Austin and Lauren Greenlief in a playoff. All three sides in the open division this year have at least one player with experience in the U.S. Women's Amateur Four-Ball Championship. Greenlief/Austin and the Spicer sisters have each played together in the event. Raquel Walker, who is playing Makayla Grubb at Fawn Lake, reached the round of 16 at this year's event, where she played with Alisa Davidova.



- Greenlief is seeking her fifth Women's Four-Ball title. She's won twice with Austin and twice with Shabril Derco. Greenlief and Derco won by two strokes over Danielle Suh and Tatum Walsh in 2019 at Fawn Lake. Greenlief has been on either the winning or runner-up side at this event every year it has been held since 2017.
- Raquel Walker won a title with sister Melanie in 2023. They originally planned to play together this year but a scheduling conflict for Melanie forced Raquel into a change of plans. Her partner, Grubb, won the VSGA Women's Amateur Championship in 2023.
- The power side in the senior division returns to play together for the first time since 2022. Natalie Easterly and Amy Ellertson won the first six Senior Women's Four-Ball titles before injuries forced Easterly out for the last two years. In their four wins in the current 36-hole format, Easterly and Ellertson won by a combined 35 strokes, including wins by 11 and 13 strokes.
- Shawn McCullough and Diane Willkens are back to defend their title in the senior division. Another side to watch features Fawn Lake member and reigning VSGA Senior Women's Amateur champion Kristen Shifflett playing with Bev Lane, who was a Senior Women's Amateur finalist in 2023.
- Joan Gardner was part of the runner-up side in the senior division last year, playing with Spotswood CC member Katie Cox. Gardner will partner this year with Mary Cabriele, a two-time VSGA Senior Women's Stroke Play winner and 2017 VSGA Senior Women's Amateur champion.
