



## 57<sup>th</sup> VSGA Junior Girls' Championship

### **NOTICE TO PLAYERS**

(This information supplements the Championship entry and the Standard Local Rules and Terms of Competition for 2026 VSGA Championships)

#### **Tee Markers**

All play will be from the **VSGA Green** tee markers.

#### **Format**

54-hole, stroke play competition, played in 18-hole rounds. The field will be cut to the low 20 players and ties following round two.

#### **Caddies/Transportation**

Players may have a caddie, but the caddie must meet the same age requirements for the tournament as the player. Players and caddies must walk at all times.

#### **Out of Bounds**

Is defined by the line between the course-side points, at ground level, of white stakes, white lines, fence posts, and the course-side edge of all public roads and the parking lots. The maintenance fence on the left side of hole #3 defines Out of Bounds. If stakes and the edge of the public roads occur at the same time, the stakes are used to define Out of Bounds.

**Dropping Zone - Hole #4:** If, during play of Hole #4, a ball is in or it is known or virtually certain that a ball that has not been found lies in the yellow penalty area, the player may:

1. proceed under Rule 17.1d; or
2. as an additional option, drop a ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the dropping zone (located on the most forward tee).

#### **Integral Objects – Stone Walls and Wooden Boards in Bunkers**

Stone walls adjacent to teeing areas are played as integral objects and players do not get free relief. As well as any wooden boards in bunkers are played as integral objects and players do not get free relief.

#### **Obstruction – Clubhouse**

The clubhouse, patio area, and adjacent flower beds are all one obstruction.

#### **Pace of Play**

Please refer to the official scorecard, VSGA Standard Local Rules (QR code below), and VSGA.org for the complete pace of play policy.

#### **Scorecards/Scoring Area**

The digital scorecard used via the app is the unofficial scorecard. The official scorecard is the paper scorecard which needs to be verified in the scoring area on the back patio of the clubhouse. A competitor is deemed to have left the scoring area when she has left the property. The scorecard is deemed returned once the player has left the scoring area.

#### **Playoff/Ties**

A sudden death playoff will be held if there is a tie for the overall champion. All other ties will be broken using the USGA scorecard playoff method.
